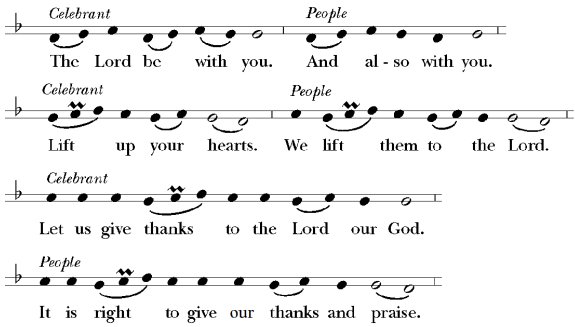
Walk in love as Christ loved us, and gave himself for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God.
